A.A. at a glance

What is A.A.?
Alcoholics Anonymous is a voluntary, non-profit, non-sectarian, non-racial, non-political, non-organizational society. The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop drinking. There are no dues or fees for A.A. membership.

Current Membership
It is estimated that there are more than 110,000 groups and over 2,000,000 members in over 100 countries.

Relations With Outside Agencies
The Fellowship has accepted a policy of "non-attachment for use without" with other organizations concerned with the problem of alcoholism. We have no opinion on groups outside A.A. and neither endorse nor oppose any society.

How A.A. Is Supported
Over the years, Alcoholics Anonymous has afforded our members a freedom of living fully without drinking and a freedom of living for others. This freedom has been made possible by the voluntary contributions of our members that may be contributed by any individual member in order to \$2.00 a year.

How to use QR codes:

- Open the camera app on your phone.
- Hold the phone so the QR code appears in view
- Tap the notification to open link associated with QR code
- This will take you to the AA.ORG website where you can download a copy of the pamphlet for your personal use.

How to get copies of these pamphlets:

- Many groups have display racks of pamphlets for those who want them.
- A.A. At A Glance is a free brochure. The others are 15-35 cents plus tax and shipping if applicable.

- Groups can give these pamphlets to newcomers, put them in a display rack, or scatter them on tables to carry this message to the alcoholic who still suffers (5th tradition).
